Chamber Music at Caltech

Caltech's Student Chamber Music Program was established in 1979, with Delores Bing as founding director. It quickly became a thriving and popular program, and continues 30 years later with some 80 undergraduate and graduate students participating this term. Students study and perform standard repertoire in the chamber music genre – music composed for a small number of instruments, with one player on each part, but without a conductor – under the guidance of professional coaches. Traditions of the Chamber Music Program include the Super Bowl Alternative Concert, Mothers Day Concert, Marathon Concerts, and the ever-popular Chamber Music at Noon programs with free lunch. Sponsored by Student Affairs, Chamber Music shares the goals of the other Performing and Visual Arts courses on campus: promoting cultural literacy, creative expression, and artistic achievement; providing stress relief; and encouraging the formation of new friendships among artistically-inclined Techers.
